## May Book Report Poetry

Due Date: May 28th

## Requirements:

- I. Choose a poem with a minimum of IO lines (there should be an appropriate number of words per line 65 words total should be the least amount) the poem should be grade and age appropriate. You should be able to understand the meaning of the poem.
- 2. SHOW ME THE POEM!! This <u>must</u> be approved before starting! You have until next Friday, May 15th then I will start assigning poems as you will be running out of time to memorize it.
  - 2. Memorize the poem.
- 3. You need to recite your poem from memory onto your Flipgrid by Thursday, May 28<sup>th</sup>. Make sure you have your code! You may use a prop if it you would like, it just cannot have your poem written on it.
- 4. The written assignment can be completed in Google Classroom also by May 28<sup>th</sup>, though they do not have to be completed at the same time. As long as you have both pieces submitted by May 28<sup>th</sup> the order and space between the submissions doesn't matter. We will be reviewing the terminology associated with poetry as we get closer which will make this step easier to complete.

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## To find a poem:

- If you have a library card, libraries are still open digitally. You can download books from the library to look for an idea.
- Do a search for "kid friendly poems"; "4<sup>th</sup> grade appropriate poems"; "poems about \_\_\_\_\_"; "poems for when you feel \_\_\_\_\_"; "poets for kids" etc...
- Ask me! I took out a number of poetry books from my local library (digitally, of course). I will select a poem for you however, if you choose this option, you get what you get, and you don't get upset!!
